What is Transition Year?

- * Transition Year is a one-year programme after Junior cycle and before Senior cycle.
- * It is an extra year <u>optional</u> programme in RCS (it is compulsory in some schools)
- * Students who do TY can opt to do LCA or traditional Leaving Certificate after the year.





Aims of Transition Year

- * To experience a Broad Curriculum of subjects
- * To develop New Skills practical and life skills
- * To avail of New Opportunities trips*, visitors (virtual & in person*), various modules
- * To experience the World of Work 1 day a week*
- * To improve on areas of Academic Weakness
- * To experience the World Abroad *
- * To give time to <u>Mature</u> year older doing LC
- * To give time to think about the <u>Future</u> and potential <u>Career Options</u>
- * Covid dependent adaptable to change annually

How do we achieve these aims in Ramsgrange Community School?

- 1. Comprehensive weekly timetable over 4 in school days (h/w and deadlines crucial)
- 2. One day per week every Tuesday for Modular work (Sept) and for **Preparation for Work** and/or Work Placement (2 x business & 1 x community)
- 3. Various additional opportunities and experiences and competitions (vary from year to year these are key for your child's successful TY year they have to <u>want</u> to take part in these!)

- PLACES WILL BE AWARDED BY EMAIL WITH LINK TO ACCEPTANCE
- TO BE ACCEPTED BY FRIDAY 25TH MARCH WITH DEPOSIT €100
- RIGHT TO APPEAL (procedure only)

Who should do Transition Year?

- Someone who really wants to improve themselves and give 100% to all experiences (not just trips)
- Someone who is POSITIVE and WILLING to get stuck in
- * Someone still unsure of what they want to do in the future and wants time to decide and experience the world of work/college visits
- * Someone who is young and could do with boosting their confidence/maturity (being young should not be only reason!)
- * Someone who missed out academically in Junior Cycle and is willing to catch up in TY and learn to work independently
- * Students Interested should complete an Application Form (avail to complete FROM OFFICE) and all students who apply will be Interviewed.
- * Max of 24 places !!!!!





Other Considerations

- * Please read the TY admissions Policy online
- * Time to make a decision for yourself not based on what your friends are/are not doing!!
- * Not a "doss year" Get out of it what you put into it
- * You have to be willing to get involved in all aspects of TY
- * Cost 2022/2023 €270 for TY activities but students will have to pay for buses also and some trips abroad
- * TRIP ABROAD/End of yr Trip –extra option possibly– asked same on application form (extra cost!!!)
- * Note: Many opportunities to reduce costs
 - * Mini Enterprises (Fruit Fridays) by TY Group or Build a Bank
 - Part time job

 - * A REPORT BY THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL RESEARCH INSTITUTE SHOWED THAT STUDENTS WHO DO TRANSITION YEAR TEND TO SCORE SIGNIFICANTLY HIGHER POINTS ON THE LEAVING CERT.
 - * TAKING SOCIAL BACKGROUND INTO ACCOUNT, THE AVERAGE CAO POINTS ADVANTAGE IS 25.
