## There are a few gentle reminders that we ask for your support on for the coming year please:

#### Uniform

The students look so well in their uniform this year, thank you parents and guardians for this. They are wearing their school colours with pride. Any question regarding the uniform policy you will find it on the school's website. A uniform check will be carried out each morning by the deputy principals. If your child has a uniform issue in the morning, please give them a note in their journal and they can get that signed by Ms Mc Donnell before the start of the school day. If there are spare uniforms available, we will give them to your child.

#### Toilets

Students have access to the toilets whenever they need. Their teacher will sign their journal if it is during class time. Students must adhere to the maximum number of students using the toilets at any one time (this has been explained to them all). First year students have their own set of toilets. Gender neutral toilets are available for all students, this is in line with best practice and regulations.

## Dropping and collecting times

In order to minimise traffic and maximise safety we are asking that parents stick to the car drop off times of 8.30 to 8.45. Buses will drop off between 8.10 and 8.30. Please do not stop on the yellow boxes or park on double yellow lines.

#### Phones

Mobile phones are banned throughout the school day. This is having a hugely positive impact on the atmosphere and interaction between students. Please phone the office if you urgently need to contact your child during the school day. If your child must leave early for an appointment, please fill out the section in the school journal the morning before they come to school.

## Vaping

Vaping is strictly forbidden anywhere on the school grounds. Students found vaping will be sanctioned and parents will be notified of same. We will be running information campaigns throughout the year on the dangers of vaping. Please can you speak to your child about these dangers also.

## Nut allergies

There are several students with nut allergies in the school. Please be mindful if sending food in with your child.
